

Basic Accreditation Frequently Asked Questions

Is there a minimum size for the pieces in Part B?

There is no minimum size for your piece(s) for Part B. However, you must make sure that you meet the requirement for a minimum of three examples in each technique category. Remember, this is your chance to demonstrate your quilling abilities, so it is up to you to decide if the size of your project will show off your skills to their best.

Do the three examples of each category have to be the same?

Follow the requirements on your sampler and make a variety as shown. Study your downloaded image of the completed sampler with annotations. For instance, in your own piece(s) you could have at least three identical Closed Loose Coils, or you can have three differently shaped Closed Loose Coils. The main thing is to make sure that the assessors can see a minimum of three examples of each category.

Is there a time limit for online Accreditation to be completed?

Yes, once you have registered you will have 6 months to submit your work. You should let the Accreditation Officer know when to expect to receive your posted sampler. The images of your own piece(s) may be emailed when ready, showing your registration number.

I'm not experienced at taking photos.

You can use your mobile/cell phone. Take several photos of your own piece(s) in good light. Try to keep them in focus. Send us a selection of your best. If they are not clear enough, we will let you know what to do.

Who should I contact if I have any questions about the Accreditation process?

It is very important that any questions you have about this process are emailed to the Accreditation Officer only, at quillingguild@yahoo.co.uk. This also means that you must not discuss this or show images on any social media sites. This is to make sure that anonymity is kept at all times and that all candidates are treated fairly, from application all the way through the assessment.
